



FREDERICK C. SAUNDERS, MD, FACP, FACG

Dr. Saunders is presently a clinical Gastroenterologist and Managing Partner for Lancaster Gastroenterology, Inc.

Dr. Saunders received a B.A. in chemistry from Union College and M.D. from Loma Linda University (1966). Postdoctoral work included an Internship, Residency and GI-NIH Fellowship at the University of Washington Hospitals through 1971 followed by a year as Instructor and Sr. Fellow in GI. He was Vice-president and President of the UW House staff Association from 1968 until 1971.

He worked as an Asst. Professor through Professor of medicine at Loma Linda University from 1972 until 1987. He held a joint appointment as Assoc. Professor of Physiology from 1977 through 1982. While there he published numerous monographs and articles in his field. Research interests included mechanisms of toxicity of aflatoxins in mammalian liver, animal and human cross-circulation or plasma exchange in human liver failure, release and control of secretin in duodenal ulcer patients and the development and use of new instruments for endoscopic retrograde cholangiopancreatography. Academic assignments included course development for introduction to medicine for Junior medical students, Chairman of the Resident Evaluation and Examination Committee for the American Board of Internal Medicine, Director and Chief of Gastroenterology Laboratories, Medical Promotions Committee and Curriculum Task Force Committee and Member of the Board of Directors, Loma Linda Medical Group.

From 1987 through 1990 He served as Director and Chief of Gastroenterology Laboratory at Presbyterian University of Pennsylvania Hospital as a Clinical Associate Professor of Medicine specializing in Therapeutic Endoscopy.

From 1990 to the present he has practiced clinical Gastroenterology in Lancaster, PA. Posts held include Managing Partner of LGI, Chief of Gastrointestinal Endoscopy at Lancaster General Hospital, Member of Institutional Review Committee, and House staff Committee at LGH.
